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Important Dates

Elizabeth has also traveled to OLR in past years. Light snacks will be served.

Leadership Opportunities

There are many ways for you to participate prior to and during the trip to Honduras! It takes many hands to make this trip possible and we would love to take advantage of any talents you have to offer! We need help with various aspects of the trip. Customs and Immigration

PRE-CHECK:

There will be a Honduras Immigration **pre-check** form to fill out 24 hours prior to departure. This is typically sent to you by your airline, found on their app with your reservation details, or by visiting: <https://prechequeo.inm.gob.hn/Login>. More details to follow closer to departure.

CUSTOMS:

You will need to fill out this form **before** going through Customs in Honduras. Take a screenshot of the QR code that you are given. You cannot pass Customs without this!

BAGGAGE CLAIM TICKET:

PLEASE hold on to your baggage claim ticket from your departure airport into SAP. Our luggage handlers will need those when we go through security at SAP.

Arrival Information

When you arrive in San Pedro Sula airport you will go through Immigration and a passport check. Then you will go to the luggage area and **claim your bag and the supply bag that you checked**. Make sure you have your baggage claim receipt handy, and provide it to the baggage handler. **Please remember to get the supply bag!** A luggage handler will help collect all of St. George's group bags and then send them through the x-ray machine together. **It is VERY important that the group and bags stay together during this process.** The group will reclaim their personal and supply bags at the end of the x-ray machine and take the bags out to the Arrivals area. Some of the supply bags will likely be pulled and searched by the customs officers. If this happens to your bag, ask someone from the Leadership Team to wait with you. A member of the group will be in the Arrivals area to greet you with the buses.

Hotel Information

We will be staying at the **Copantl Hotel**: Res. Los Arcos, Blvr. del Sur, San Pedro Sula 21104, Honduras. 011 504 2516-8900

- The hotel rooms have a refrigerator, hairdryer, shampoo, soap, and safes.
- Breakfast is included in the price of your room.
- There are three restaurants on the property.
- If the safe does not work or there is no refrigerator, contact the Front Desk.
- **Do not drink tap water or brush your teeth with the tap water in the hotel room.** Use bottled/purified water only. There is a water cooler in the lobby with drinkable water available.
- Two bottles of purified water are provided by the hotel each day per room.
- Bottled water is available for purchase from the hotel or you can purchase at the grocery store on Sunday afternoon.
- The hotel has laundry service.
- Carry pocket-size containers of hand sanitizer with you.
- The hotel has WIFI, a pool, a restaurant, and ample space to sit and relax.

Money

Everyone will need to travel with some **USD CASH** on their person, as well as a credit card (NOT DEBIT) for other purchases and for your hotel room incidentals. Honduras currency is *Lempira*.

Exchange rate: \$1(USD) equals approx. 24.5 Lempira. The exchange rate is usually better on a credit card vs cash exchange. You will not need ANY Lempira.

Examples of cost/per person:

- Travel days: Airport lunch \$25, Snacks \$15, Book/Magazine \$10
- Lunch or dinner at hotel \$20 (plan for 5 lunches/ 2-3 dinners)
- Snacks for room from grocery store \$25-40/pp

Hotel:

- You **MUST** have a credit card on file for your incidentals. The hotel cost is included in your pre-paid fees.
- You **MUST** have \$10 (USD cash)/pp for your hotel cleaning tip.
- Please have \$5 bills for tips for room service or bellmen to bring your luggage/groceries to your room.

Grocery/Restaurants/Shopping:

- You can use Visa and Mastercard at the grocery and restaurants.
- We will go to the grocery store on the first or second day of the trip to purchase snacks/drinks for the hotel room. They do have Gatorade and some other “American” foods.
- We will try to go to the Guamilito market one day. They accept USD cash and cards. You may want smaller USD cash bills for this. Please do not barter.

OLR Rules

- Do not bring valuables of any kind.
- Do not let the girls use your cameras, phones, or any other electronics. This takes away from our time with the girls and is a distraction to them and others.
- OLR prohibits posting any photos of OLR girls on your Instagram/ Snapchat/ Facebook/Tic Tock page or on the Internet. This is for their protection!
- All gifts for girls must be taken to the office to be logged in; we cannot give gifts directly to any girls due to the non-profit nature of the organization.
- Never play the role of maternal or paternal figure for a girl of OLR. Most OLR girls have parents, some of them play important roles in their lives. Volunteers, godparents and visitors are considered the girls’ extended family.
- It is NEVER appropriate to be alone with a girl in any area or room, without close supervision by OLR staff.
- ALWAYS show responsible and appropriate behavior, especially in front of the girls. Follow all directions of the OLR staff. Use common sense.
- Our Psychologist wants male visitors to pay attention to physical contact with the girls. It is inappropriate to allow older girls to sit on laps, to embrace or to drape arms around them, or use any other behavior that may be considered inappropriate.
- Please dress appropriately for church and outings with the girls. For church long pants and modest tops are required. No shorts and revealing tops please. **DRESS CODE:** No midriffs, no low-cut shirts/ tanks / no super short skirts or shorts.

Packing List

You may take one carry-on bag and one checked bag (your checked bag can be no more than 50lbs). Put identification information on your luggage where it is easily seen. Please include on a piece of paper inside your checked bags: "Your name / Copantl Hotel 504 2561-8900 / San Pedro Sula". You may be asked to carry one additional checked bag with group supplies. Please keep up with this bag; we will reimburse you for the extra-bag fee with the airline. **Place your passport in your carry-on bag, pocket, or purse.** Make a copy of the front page of your passport; put it in your carry-on bag. The current TSA rule for liquids in carry-on bags is 3oz containers or less and only as many containers as you can put in a quart size Ziploc bag. *For more information go to the TSA and/or FAA websites.* **Do not bring or wear any jewelry or valuables! This is for your safety!**

*****DRESS CODE REMINDER, AS LISTED IN YOUR SIGNED COVENANT:**

No midriffs, no low-cut shirts/ tanks/ no super short skirts or shorts***

Clothing:

- Athletic tops/t-shirts
- Athletic shorts/tennis skirts
- Pants/leggings for possible Planet Jump outing
- Socks for possible Planet Jump outing
- Tennis shoes/work shoes/sandals/flip-flops
- Swimsuit and Coverup
- Hat, sunglasses, visors, and/or bandanas.
- For church or going out to dinner:
- Men: One Shirt with collar and one pair of slacks or long shorts
- Women: Sundress/long skirt or nice slacks and blouses
- One mask just in case!

Miscellaneous:

- Black Sharpie pen to use for signing T- shirts.
- Beach towel that you can leave there for the girls.
- Sun-block SPF 30-50+ (we are almost on the equator!)
- Insect/mosquito repellent containing Deet
- Backpack or tote bag to carry things between hotel and OLR
- Refillable water bottle
- Hydration packets (Nuun, Liquid IV, etc.)
- Phone/electronic chargers
- Card games to leave at OLR- SkipBo, Uno, standard playing cards, etc.

Toiletries/Medications:

- Personal hygiene items (deodorant, toothbrush/toothpaste, bath soap)
- Lip balm
- Hand sanitizer
- Pepto-Bismol tablets for GI prophylaxis EVERY DAY
- Roloids, Other Over the Counter Meds such as, Alka-Seltzer, Tylenol, Advil, Immodium, cold medications, etc.
- Prescription medications (keep in carry-on bag)
