



## MUSIC NOTES

Reflecting on today's Gospel reading, *Comfort, comfort ye my people* is a well-known Advent hymn found our hymnal (hymn 67), and in our offertory anthem today, it is playfully set to music by contemporary American composer David Ashley White (b.1944). The original hymn tune is quite rhythmic and jubilant, and White develops these characteristics even further. Not only does whole anthem move through different time signatures, the sopranos and altos sing a different, yet complementary line to that of the tenors and basses. When all four part comes together, it creates a sharp and crisp effect. Though at first, it may seem as if the anthem *If ye love me* by Thomas Tallis is out of season, it does reflect the message of today's reading from Philippians. The beautifully subtle harmonic movement expresses the text in fluid motion. This work is arguably the most well-known anthem by this Tallis, who has a versatile range of styles and stands out for his simplicity and refined craftsmanship.
